Stan Jones is a retired Managing Director of Rolls Royce Transmission & Distribution and he was active in the community in Newcastle-upon-Tyne, chairing several committees, including the South Tyneside TEC. He is on the Hughenden Parish Council and on the police National and Bucks Independent Advisory Groups. With NHW, he is Area Co-ordinator for Great Kingshill and he joined the WDNHWA committee on 15th July 2008. He became Secretary on 21st September 2010 and Chairman on 1st January 2015.

Geoff Pegg is a retired businessman having been involved in international trade for most of his working life. He has lived in the Wycombe District since 1967. He started attending WDNHWA committee meetings in 1999 and joined the committee as Treasurer in 2000.
